

COVID-19 PANDEMIC CONTROL

Office Operations Guideline



Showrooms should not be accessible to the public – please lock all doors.



In an effort to eliminate the risk of infection, do not accept "inperson" COD/credit card payments using the credit card machine – a telephone credit card transaction is acceptable.



Visitors should discard disposable gloves in a closed container or take the gloves with them upon exiting.



Wipe down workspace throughout the day with antiviral wipes or by using disinfectant spray and paper towels.



Display a sign on the front and back doors to direct customers to call the office for service.



Visitors, except for authorized government representatives (police, paramedic, safety officers, etc.), are not to enter the building office.



Handwashing signs should be displayed throughout the building.



Increase cleaning and disinfecting measures with your local cleaning company.



Customers must call to place their orders and pick up the product from the warehouse.



All visitors entering our facility must use hand sanitizer before putting on disposable gloves.



Wash your hands often – as a backup hand sanitizer should be available in remote areas. Handwashing is preferred over sanitizer as it is generally more effective.



Customer returns will not be accepted until further notice.
